EDUCATORS, PARENTS, AND CAREGIVERS

Use this toolkit, along with the book *Mistletoe and the Christmas Kittens* by Joe Troiano and the movie *Spookley and the Christmas Kittens*, to help your young ones understand the power of unselfish acts of kindness.

Let's Talk Read *Mistletoe and the Christmas Kittens* by Joe Troiano or listen to it on Spookley's YouTube Channel. Discuss its themes.

QUESTIONS	KEY THEMES AND OBJECTIVES
What did the other cats at the barn do when they saw Mistletoe? Why?	They ran away because he looked different. <i>Guide children to avoid judging someone based on how they look.</i>
What did Mistletoe do when he saw their reaction?	He spent his life hiding. <i>Use empathy to help children realize how they would feel if they were left out.</i>
Why did Mistletoe care so much about the three kittens?	He identified with their situation: being without a home. <i>Help children see that they can help others even if they themselves are in a difficult situation. In fact, generosity may bring a reward of its own!</i>
Why did Mistletoe hide when he heard the children coming?	He thought the children would judge him, as the other cats did when he was a kitten. <i>Lead children to recognize that other peoples' behavior does not represent the feelings of all.</i>

ideas for teamwork

1. Mistletoe had never met the kittens before, but he marched all night through a snowstorm to find a home for them. Has a stranger ever done something nice for you?
1. Mistletoe spent his life hiding because he thought his strange colors would make people scared or angry. Do you think he was right to hide?
2. There are many chances for you to help people in your community or family, in your town, school, or at home. Think of three things you can do all by yourself to make someone's day better.
3. Thinking of the needs of others more than your own is called being **selfless**. Mistletoe was **selfless** when he brought the kittens to the farmhouse even though he was freezing and tired. Can you think of another story you know where a character was selfless? What happened to them?

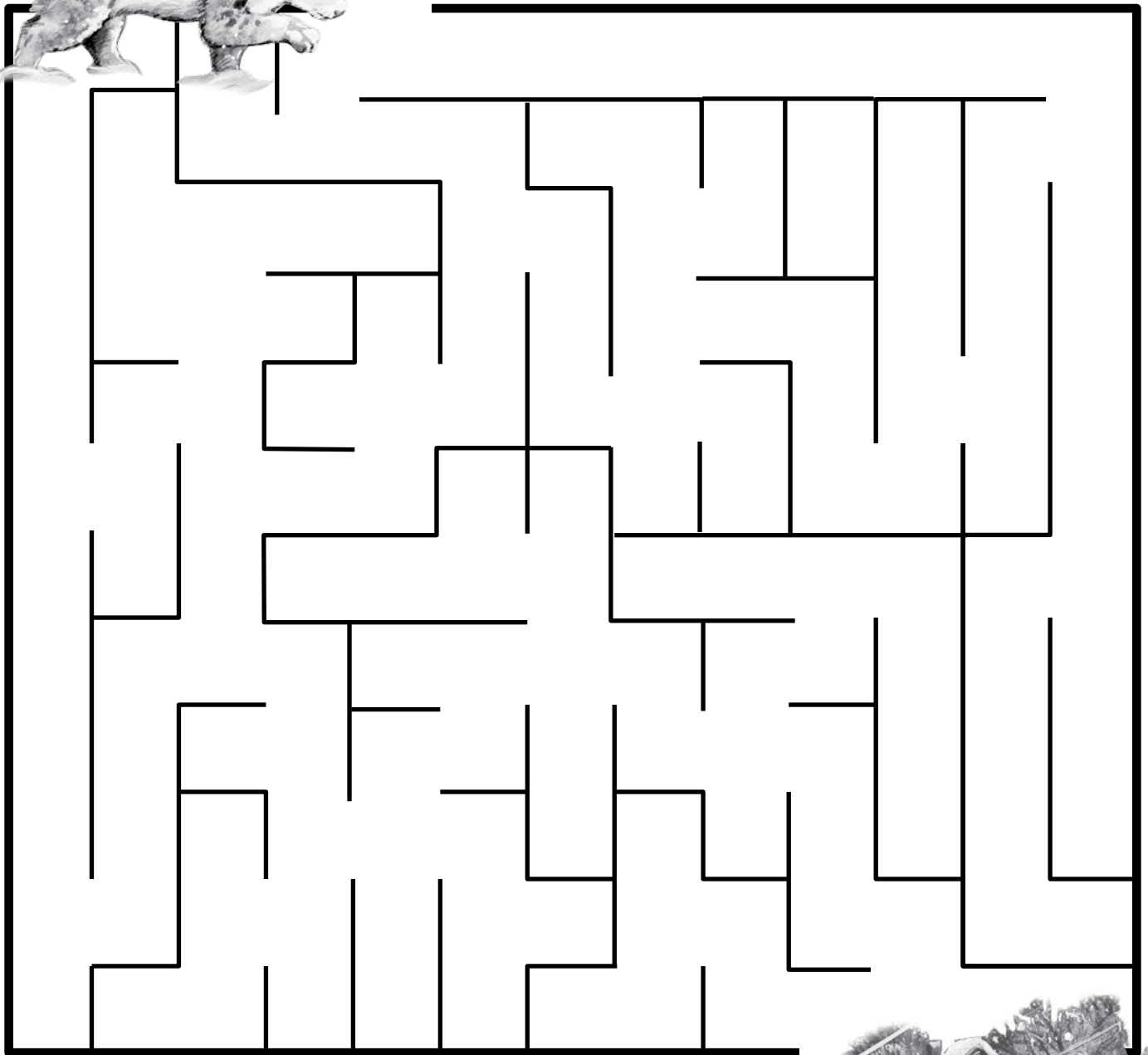
